

## Certificate II in Automotive Vocational Preparation (AUR20720) (full completion)

### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Certificate II in Automotive Vocational Preparation is a pre-vocational program designed to introduce students to automotive theory and culture. It provides a solid foundation in the practical skills required to successfully gain an apprenticeship in the automotive industry. Units cover industry research, using and maintaining measuring equipment, operate electrical testing equipment, electronics and vehicle engine reconditioning and maintenance.

### WHO SHOULD APPLY?

Students interested in further study in specialist or industry specific streams of the automotive industry. The program will also appeal to students seeking a sound working knowledge of basic automotive procedures. With additional training and experience, future employment opportunities may include trimmer, detailer, panel beater, heavy or light vehicle mechanic. People working in trades are in high demand.

### WORK PLACEMENTS

The VCAA strongly recommends a minimum of 80 hours of work placement for this program.

### CONTRIBUTION TO THE VCE

Students undertaking this VET DSS program through the VCE stream are eligible for credit of up to four VCE VET units on their VCE Statement of Results: two units at Unit 1-2 level and a Unit 3-4 sequence.

Students may be entitled to 10% increment towards their VCE.

Students undertaking this VET DSS program through the VCE Vocational Major stream will need to complete a minimum of 180 nominal hours of a VET DSS program over a 2-year period.

- Completion of both VCE and VET certificates
- Possible credits from other TAFE courses
- Opportunity to undertake work placement
- Accredited entry level for other TAFE and university courses
- Pathways to further training
