# Certificate II in Horticulture (AHC20422) (partial completion)

#### **PROGRAM DESCRIPTION**

Students who are interested in picking up apprenticeship and traineeships or further study at Certificate III, IV and Diploma level should apply. Students may be entitled to 10% increment towards their VCE.

Students undertaking this VET DSS program through the VCE Vocational Major stream will need to complete a minimum of 180 nominal hours of a VET DSS program over a 2-year period.
