#### **PROGRAM DESCRIPTION**

Partial completion of the Certificate II in Agriculture aims to encourage student to understand the industry and gain experience in working with livestock, farm work, environmental sustainability, chemical usage farm maintenance and gain the basic skills to working on a farm and in the agriculture industry.

Students who love the outdoors and want to be part of an industry that provides Australia with a viable, healthy, profitable and sustainable future. Students who are interested in picking up apprenticeship and traineeships or further study at Certificate III, IV and Diploma level should apply.

#### **PATHWAYS**

Pathways include Certificate III in Agriculture, Certificate III in Agriculture (Diary Production), Certificate IV in Agriculture or Diploma of Agriculture.

Jobs within the sector range from farmhands, farm business managers and include numerous agricultural service roles.

#### **WORK PLACEMENTS**

The VCAA strongly recommends a minimum of 80 hours of work placement for this program.

#### **CONTRIBUTION TO THE VCE**

Students undertaking this VET DSS program through the VCE stream are eligible for credit of up to four VCE VET units on their VCE Statement of Results: two units at Unit 1-2 level and a Unit 3-4 sequence.

Students may be entitled to 10% increment towards their VCE.

Students undertaking this VET DSS program through the VCE Vocational Major stream will need to complete a minimum of 180 nominal hours of a VET DSS program over a 2 year period.
